Lessons from Pentecost: (from The Holy Spirit by Mateen Elass)

- 1. The movement of the Holy Spirit is not subject to our timing or control.
- 2. The Spirit is given equally to men and women.
 - Galatians 3:26-29 (p. 1813)
- 3. The gift of the Spirit is cause for great joy.
- 4. The Spirit graces God's people with supernatural gifts.
- 5. The Spirit enlivens the church for the primary work of evangelism.
- 6. Pentecost makes clear that God is on the move to reach the whole world with his love.
 - Genesis 11:1-9 (p. 15)
- 7. The Spirit creates a new community recapitulating the life of Jesus Christ.
